

Business Impact Estimate

Proposed ordinance's title/reference:

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING AND ENACTING A NEW CODE OF ORDINANCES FOR LIBERTY COUNTY, FLORIDA; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES NOT INCLUDED THEREIN; PROVIDING FOR THE MANNER OF AMENDING SUCH CODE; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance codifies existing Liberty County ordinances and adopts them into a unified County Code of Ordinances and Development Code. This does not change any Liberty County ordinances. Instead, it organizes existing ordinances into a unified code that is more easily accessible to the public through the website Municode.
